THE SCHOOL

Union School was established in 1919 as a nonsectarian institution catering to the children of U.S. Marine Corps families stationed in Haiti. It is a Private, college-preparatory day school. It has built a strong reputation based on student achievements, a rigorous academic curriculum, dedicated staff, and a supportive community. The school promotes diversity and inclusion with students from over 15 nationalities. Spanning across a 2-hectare facility, Union School encompasses three buildings, over 35 classrooms equipped with modern technology, dedicated areas for preschool, music, and art, as well as well-equipped labs, a library, sports facilities, and a learning center. Academic programs include preschool, elementary, middle, and high school levels, along with specialized support, enrichment, and social-emotional learning programs catering to various grade levels.

Additional Information

Due to Haiti's political and security instability, the Class of 2025 has faced significant challenges over the past four years. They had to navigate extended periods of distance learning during Grades 10 and 11. The instability also led to the loss of several teachers, forcing students to take online courses in multiple subjects to make up for the gaps. As a result, their class size has decreased from 24 students to the current 9.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum is that of a U.S. general academic and college preparatory school. Instruction is in English with French as 'World Language' classes (grades Pk3- 11). Honors/Advanced sections are offered at different grades in secondary school. Our academic program in High School is organized on a fix yearly schedule. A maximum load is 7-credits per year, with students exposed to a minimum of 150-instructional hours per credit a year.

Applicants are required to present a transcript from an accredited school and to pass a placement test for admission. Regular admission requires English proficiency. Our Learning Center program tailors to a limited number of students diagnosed with mild to moderate learning needs

GRADING SCALE

All Secondary level students are graded on a 100-point scale. Letter Equivalents are:

- A = 90-100
- B = 80-89
- C = 70-79
- D = 65-69
- F = 64 and below

70% is passing average in Math and English

TESTING

The NWEA MAP test is administered in grades Kinder-12. Students are tested in the areas of Reading Comprehension, Language Usage, Math, and Science. Union School is a test center for the PSAT 8/9, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and AP.

GRADING

High School GPA is determined by the cumulative grade point average beginning with grade 9.

- Additional points are added in Advanced courses, Honors courses, (3-points per year) and Advanced Placement (5- points per year) classes for a weighted cumulative grade point average (Courses are described in the following order of rigor: Regular, Advanced, Honors and Advanced Placement).
- Students with a grade point average of 88 to 94 for a marking period are awarded Honors. To earn High Honors a student must have an average of 95 or better.
- Students with a cumulative average of 88 or higher may be considered for membership in the local chapter of the National Honor Society or the National Junior Honor Society.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
